CONFERENCE: XIX Geometrical Seminar

August 28 – September 4, 2016, Zlatibor, Serbia

This is the 19th meeting of the Geometrical Seminar which started its activities during the eighties in the last century, under the name Yugoslav Geometrical Seminar. At the beginning, the seminar was of the national level. With great efforts meetings were organized even in the difficult period of the nineties, but, nevertheless, the level of meetings has raised, the XVII and XVIII Geometrical Seminar, which took place in Zlatibor 2012 and Vrnjacka Banja 2014, had over 100 participants from more than 30 countries. The aim of these meetings is to bring together mathematicians and physicists interested in geometry and its applications, to give lectures on new results, exchange ideas, problems and conjectures.

It is with deep regret that we inform the participants of the XIX Geometrical Seminar that, the initiator, organizer and supporter of all these Geometrical Seminars, Academician Professor Mileva Prvanovic, passed away in Belgrade on February 12, 2016. The XIX Geometrical Seminar will be devoted to the memory of Professor Mileva Prvanovic.

Conference fee: The conference fee is 200 Euro, and 80 Euro for students and accompanying persons. The conference fee will cover conference materials, coffee breaks, cocktail, excursion, farewell party. The payment instructions will be given soon.

Accommodation: Accommodation and all activities will take place at the "Ratko Mitrović" hotel, Student's Resting-House of the University of Belgrade. The resting-house is situated in pine woods, above the Sport Centre and gives special conditions for active resting in the nature. The hotel prices for participants will be about 25 - 35 Euro (in a single or a double room for full board) per day.

There will be provided two special buses for transfer of participants on August 28, which will start from Belgrade (Faculty of Mathematics, Studentski trg 16 at 16.30 and "Nikola Tesla" Airport at 17.00) to Zlatibor, and on September 4 (departure day) in the morning (approx. at 9.30) from Zlatibor to Belgrade. The bus ride from Belgrade to Zlatibor takes around four hours.

Also, there will be organized transfer between Belgrade Airport, Belgrade railway station, as well as Belgrade bus station, and Studentski trg (Faculty of Mathematics).

Social activities: Preliminary, on Wednesday, August 31, an excursion is planned to Perućac (Serbia), Višegrad and Andrić grad (Bosnia and Herzegovina).

Perućac is a tourist village on the right bank of the River Drina, 13 km away from Bajina Bašta. In the vicinity there is a large hydroelectric dam where the Drina Lake, 54 km long, begins. Its magnificent canyon stretches all the way to Višegrad. On the right and partly on the left bank of the River Drina, from the both sides of the River Rzav that flows into the Drina, among conical wooded hills there is the town **Višegrad**. The greatest attraction of the town is the bridge over the Drina built by Mehmed Paša Sokolović in 1571. The planned tour: meeting at lake Perućac at 08.30; control of travel documents, boarding the boat, departure at 09.00; driving through the canyon of the Drina river to Višegrad; arrival at Višegrad around 12.15. Free time for visit the old bridge of Mehmed Paša Sokolović, Andrić grad (Andrić's town), Višegrad; departure back by bus to Perućac at 15.00; arrival at Perućac around 18.15.
